Lanark Wardens & Perth Mayors

When Britain seized the French colony of Quebec in 1759, the 3,026 square kilometers (1,168 square miles) that would one day become the County of Lanark was an undelineated patch of forest within Algonquin First Nation territory, west of the Ottawa River.

An administrative re-organization of the British Province of Quebec in 1788 divided the colony into four districts, with the future locale of Lanark County falling within the District of Mecklenburg, a swath of land north of the St. Lawrence River lying within map lines drawn from the mouths of the Gananoque and Trent Rivers, north to the Ottawa River.

The Constitutional Act of 1791 created the separate colonies of Lower Canada (Quebec) and Upper Canada (Ontario) and the following year re-named Mecklenburg District as Midland District. In 1798 a further re-drawing of district boundaries divided Midland District by carving-off Johnstown District within which lay the future Lanark County.

In 1822 another division created the District of Bathurst as that part of the former Johnstown District lying north of the Rideau River, including all of the territory that would later become the Counties of Lanark, Renfrew, and Carleton.

When Upper and Lower Canada were rejoined in 1840, as the United Province of Canada, the associated legislation also established, for the first time, municipal government in the form of local councils managing districts, townships, villages, towns, and cities.

A decade later the revised Upper Canada Municipal Corporations Act of 1849 abolished the districts, replacing them with counties, including creation of the United Counties of Lanark and Renfrew.

The Municipal Act of 1849 also led to the 1853 incorporation of the Town of Perth as a distinct municipality.

Over the 170 plus years since passing of the Municipal Corporations Act, chains of office have been worn by more than 50 men and women elected as Mayors of Perth and by nearly 150 others chosen as Wardens of the County of Lanark.

From 1849 until 1866 the Counties of Lanark and Renfrew were administered by a single combined council, but on September 23, 1866, they became separate and distinct municipalities. Lanark County Council continued to meet at Perth, as it had since 1850, while Renfrew County Council chose Pembroke as its County seat.
